1. Data Submission

Goes to OCEACT as well as the state for Quarter 3

Quarter 4 does go through the web portal only

-To comply with US DOJ performance plan, they dictated what elements are collected will be used for performance plan, constant program improvement and quality improvement. This is about having the appropriate amount of data points to track aggregate data. There will be additional ability to conduct analysis on individual programs. Ability enhanced to look at trends. Conversation about incarceration statistics tracking will continue offline as per Wendy. List is driven by OPP. OCEACT Goal is to assist with data uniformity. Explanatory variables include taking medication as prescribed. Clarification of medication adherence ensued. Hospitalizations include 370s and all psych hospitalizations define as acute or sub-acute. OCEACT will work to have this reporting be meaningful and useful outcome data. Further question of putting together subcommittee to gather additional input and improve data collection and difficulty larger programs are having tracking all data points and reporting.

-Subject of ACT funding being stopped following hospitalizations – defined as antithesis of the ACT program and how to balance such impacts, more clarification to follow. Pam Hyde's role is guidance and monitoring efforts to comply with DOJ performance plan, she is a consultant.

-Possibility of SUDS reporting being adjusted to accommodate reporting. Several programs report being able to report data with little impact, larger programs expressed concerns. Demographic information may be added to OARS. MOTS reporting and complying with federal requirements is part of being a Medicaid provider.

2. HIPAA Compliance on the new web based portal.

-Web portal is built according to Oregon Administrative Rule. Processes are in place to protect individual health information. Business associates agreement clarifies expectations and can be requested between Options for Southern Oregon and individual agencies. OCEACT aims to meet privacy and security requirements.

3. OCEACT Conference for 2018.

June 12 and 13th, save the dates, for the conference. Team leader roundtable breakout session discussed. Record attendance last year was 212, we expect 250 this year. OCEACT is planning 6 breakout

sessions. Input about session length. Ethics CEU's requested for licensure in terms of keynote and breakouts. Topics suggested include coercion, privacy, incentive driven programs, texting, coordination with other agencies and best practices in communication. Gray zone discussion of nuances and standard frameworks for best practices. Exploring medical information, rep payee, and landlord issues related to ethics. Hearing voices requested. Discussion of lack of benefit of 'vent' sessions. Handouts requested. Trauma informed care is valuable and a focal point and secondary trauma requested. Best practices for transitioning from ACT. Talk about benefit of OT perspective for skill. Prelude for act leaders? Conflict resolution. Axis II for ACT discussion. Housing and homelessness impacts. Safety.
