- OHA Updates
 - Blanca announced that OHA has hired on a new ACT coordinator who will be joining in the next couple week.
- ACT Fidelity
 - Fully year of fidelity reviews resumed.
 - Feedback from teams on fidelity review
 - For OHA, it would be nice if there were a standardized rate from the state to the CCOs for compensating ACT programs.
 - Each CCO is different and OHA is looking into what rates or reimbursements would look like and what it looks like now. It is something that OHA is reviewing.
 - Heidi – there is a clear budget for how ACT should be funded which has been provided to the state. This should be taken into account by CCOs when budgeting for ACT.

- CPMC
 - The second cohort has wrapped up as of mid July. We see the people having more engagement strategies in helping meet people where they are at in their recovery journey. Some ACT Teams are wanting to get their whole staff certified. We are always building a waitlist and a third cohort will be starting in late August or September.
- Technical Assistance Topic Requests:
 - Heidi Herinckx - Substance use services have taken a hit in the last couple years with not being able to do groups. We know that during the COVID period that folks have continued to have issues related to substance use and the isolation and struggles of these times have exacerbated their struggles. Agencies are really taking a look at these services and our findings from the first year of returning the fidelity reviews is that we need to beef up the substance use treatment services.
 - Doug Huston shared they had a case manager share on dream savers accounts and ABLE accounts. People on SSDI ability to save money
 - Creative ways people have found to integrate people into the community in activities that aren't segregated

- Coaching and advocacy for ACT teams in the community
 - Stanford is doing something on families and psychosis
 - Having people with lived experience share how they have redefined and managed their mental health.
